ADVOCATING FOR YOUR BUSINESS

Connecting Sister Cities...

For years, I have been very interested in establishing a contemporary formal relationship between Manchester New Hampshire, and Manchester England. The shared history between the two communities is obvious. We all learned about our community being founded as a rebirth of sorts of Manchester, England, in fourth grade history class. I have often wondered what would happen if we were able to take that relationship full-circle, and return to Manchester England to bond together for a new revitalized relationship of the 21st century. I am in early conversations with our Board of Directors and our Mayor to further explore establishing a sister city relationship with Manchester, England. We know that numerous British companies are already doing business in New Hampshire: BAE and Segway being two great examples.

Sister Cities International is a non-profit citizen diplomacy network that creates and strengthens partnerships between the United States and international communities. Currently more than 2,000 American cities, states and communities are partnered in 136 countries around the world. The organization strives to build global cooperation at the municipal level, to promote cultural understanding and stimulate economic development. The current mission of Sister Cities International is: "to promote peace through mutual respect, understanding and cooperation one individual, one community at a time." One of the focuses of the organization is on people-to-people exchanges to build long-term relationships between the U.S. and international municipalities. Often those relationships evolve into valuable economic development partnerships based on shared interest of commodity and product exchanges.

I was fortunate to participate with establishing a Sister City relationship while working in another New Hampshire community. In that instance, the city's Mayor, numerous public and private sector individuals and I traveled to the Sister City and sought to establish a formal relationship. We visited the abroad city for three days and met numerous business people, elected officials, and other community leaders. We visited schools, hospitals, the theater, and local dining establishments. We talked about ideas, hopes, challenges and opportunities. We shared ideas and discussed solutions to problems. The benefits of that exchange were profound and needless to say, we learned a lot from one another.

So to appease my curiosity about a Sister City for Manchester, I recently called the President and CEO of the Greater Manchester Chamber of Commerce in Manchester, UK. We had a wonderful conversation focused on what the Sister City relationship would bring to our respective communities. We agreed that although potentially great for trade, the opportunities this formal relationship brings to both cities is larger than products and services. "This is beyond trade," my counterpart in England stated firmly. He's right; I agree this relationship is about the knowledge economy, it's about life sciences, financial services and academics. There are a few more conversations that need to take place, but if the idea remains viable after being subjected to all of the proper tests of credibility, we will begin to put our strategies to paper to develop a plan and specific tactics to move forward.

I have recently learned Manchester, England has a population of 3.2 million, with 92,000 V.A.T. paying businesses.

They are home to a large sophisticated metropolitan airport, and three of the country's largest universities. There is a vital arts community that is anchored in classical music, their symphony is renowned. Like us, Manchester, England's highest commercial growth is found in small and medium sized enterprises. We share our history of being a mill town that has emerged as a dominant force in the culture of England, and a major contributor to its economy. We share language and many other rich customs unique to both communities.

If all of this moves from the exploration phase to the development and execution phase, it would mean a trans-Atlantic visit by each community to the other. The visits will provide the chance for businesspeople, educators, historians, artists and politicians to meet one another and experience first-hand other ways of doing business. It would also allow conversations to occur about how all of the vital elements and pillars of community are dove-tailed together to create, sustain and develop a place where business can thrive and communities can blossom to their fullest potential and be as rich as they are capable.

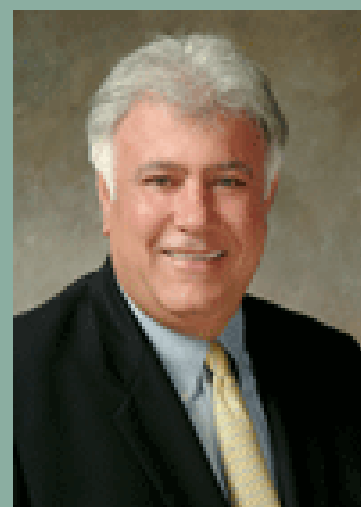
