and making our organization better and stronger thanks to member suggestions.

With this new membership system, the Greater Manchester Chamber of Commerce has shifted its focus to account management. The Chamber staff are working hard to ensure that members are receiving and utilizing their member benefits such as enhanced web listings, membership disks, newsletter inserts and sponsorship dollars. It has created a huge shift in the Chamber's business model. The organization is no longer focused on just getting you to join, we want you to get involved: join a committee, attend an event, use your marketing opportunities or simply send us an email and tell us what you think.

As we shift to this new system of

membership, which has increased our retention rate and pumped new life and energy into many of our events, we are happy to share with you that you can now access your benefit report online for all of your trackable benefits such as event attendance and marketing products.

## RESTAURANT WEEK A HUGE SUCCESS

### SECOND EVENT PLANNED FOR OCTOBER 2011

The Greater Manchester Chamber of Commerce is pleased to announce that the Chamber's first Restaurant Week event was received as a great success.

"We were very busy!" said Jeff Paige, Chef at Cotton. "Most people really seemed to embrace the event, over 50% said they were 1st time visitors at Cotton and several guests were from Massachusetts."

The event was so successful that the Chamber is planning to make it an annual event and will hold the event from October 16-23, 2011. The event encourages people to wine and dine, visit the theatre, museums and attractions or even plan to stay the night.

"It was one of our busiest weeks in the 10 years Cotton has been open!" said Paige. Restaurant Week works as a cooperative marketing campaign that promotes all

participating restaurants through a single event. Twenty-five of Greater Manchester's best restaurants participated in the event and each offered a three-course meal for dinner for \$29.95 (excluding beverages, taxes and gratuity). Restaurant weeks in other areas have brought in over 12,000 diners to the area during the event.

"The Manchester restaurant scene has been growing and it's time more people came out to experience the variety, quality and great culinary delights our city has to offer," said Robin Comstock, President and CEO of the Greater Manchester Chamber of Commerce.

# ADVOCATING FOR YOUR BUSINESS

## Wrapping 99 years...

As I put pen to pad for this article, I can't help but be reflective of the fact that this is the last article, of the last month of our 99th year in business. It is as much of an honor as it is humbling to be the person at the helm during this historic period of transition of this incredible organization. Next month we will begin the celebration of our centennial anniversary. But, for today, I am thinking about 2010, and all that we were, and all that we did the last year of our first century.

We began the New Year in January in new office space, with a new mission statement, and new external model to deliver all of the features and benefits of membership. We also implemented a new internal model that welcomed several new employees, and introduced a management team of highly skilled individuals who have exceptional ability in their particular areas of expertise. Their energy, enthusiasm and professionalism shine through everything they do and touch.

In 2010 we administered over 100 events. The standard events drew on average, several hundred business attendees. By all accounts, the annual events broke all prior quality and attendance records. The monthly events such as Network PM were hosted 12 times, and its morning counterpart Network AM occurred each month too. Tuesdays at the Chamber became "Value-added Tuesdays" and our monthly portfolio of programs including: Member-led Workshop, Lunchtime Connections, and Spotlight On Business exploded in popularity that resulted in exceptional attendance records.

New programs were also introduced. PechaKucha a presentation style developed in Japan popped onto the

scene, it was so popular four more will be held at the chamber in 2011 to stimulate a dialogue about important community issues. Sojourn Power Hour with Dr. Russ Ouellette filled the room with CEO's who wanted to experience a conversation with experts on important leadership issues.

In 2010 we supported more than 200 volunteers, all of whom are business people carving precious time out of both their personal and professional lives to give back to the community by making substantive time commitments to their chamber of commerce. To each and every one of you, I want to say thank you. We would not be in existence nor would we be an organization of influence and power without you. The volunteer appreciation event was also introduced as a wonderful banquet filled with our motivated and excited volunteers who engaged in a terrific table-top roundtable conversation while glowing in the environment of gratitude.

Special programs were meaningful and dynamic too; Tri-City proved that some things just keep getting better and better. The energy was so high at the event, you could feel it in the air. People's faces literally ached from smiling and talking so much. Leadership Greater Manchester soared well beyond anyone's expectations. The program was revamped, and reworked and unveiled the first phase of fundamental improvements in the program. The changes clearly resonated with participants as there were many more applicants than available space in the program.

We are also proud of our work as an advocate for the business community through our Government Affairs, Green, Infrastructure, Downtown, and Metro-

Center-NH committees. In Concord, this Chamber fought to repeal the LLC tax, opposed increases to business taxes, supported efforts to bring renewable energy to Manchester, and advocated for increased investment in our State's aging infrastructure systems.

Locally, the Chamber supported the successful adoption of the International Existing Building Code in Manchester which will help downtown redevelopment efforts. On a region-wide basis, the Chamber continued its strong support of the NH Capitol Corridor rail project and played a critical role in securing a \$2.24 million dollar federal grant that will be used to complete the necessary planning and environmental work for the project.

Other 2010 initiatives include the establishment of a "Green Pledge" program that will allow businesses of all shapes and sizes to grade how "green" they are and a new policy development roundtable series that provided all members with a role in shaping the future strategic goals of the Chamber.

We all feel very proud and fortunate to be a part of this organization as it leaves its last century and moves into the next. Members of my staff and I feel humbled knowing we have been entrusted as caretakers of the chamber of commerce at this extraordinary time as we wrap up our 99th year and begin the celebration of our members and our 100 year anniversary.
